The 2023 competition will have five classes: Novice, Intermediate, Open, Intermediate Pairs & Novice Pairs. Hedges should be laid in the “Devon” style using crooks to secure the finished length.

Competitors should report in time to sign in and then attend a briefing at 9:00am. The draw for lengths will follow. The competition will start at 9:30am and finish at 2:45pm.

Please bring sufficient crooks for your own use together with your own tools. A limited number of crooks will be available on the day for Novice and Novice Pairs competitors without their own.

Hot food will be provided for all those taking part. Each competitor/pair will also get a £15 cutting fee.

Prizes

Open Class – supported by Sheamus Machin 1st £60 & The Percy Duck Challenge Cup, 2nd £40, 3rd £25, 4th £15

Intermediate Class – supported by MNR Mowers 1st £50 & The Dugdale Cup, 2nd £35, 3rd £25, 4th £10

Intermediate Pairs – supported by Francis Bugler Ltd 1st £40 & Trophy, 2nd £30, 3rd £20, 4th £10

Novice Class – supported by Cornish Mutual 1st £40 & Trophy, 2nd £30, 3rd £20, 4th £10

Novice Pairs – supported by Blamphayne Sawmills 1st £40 & Trophy, 2nd £30, 3rd £20, 4th £10

All competitors/pairs winning a cash prize will also get their £15 cutting fee.

- The John Coombes Memorial Shield will be awarded to the best competitor aged under 19.
- A cup will be presented to the best local competitor living within the Blackdown Hills AONB.
- A cup will be presented to the Best Lady competitor from any class.
- A veteran’s trophy will be awarded to the best competitor over 60 years of age.
- The Terry Copp memorial tankard will be awarded to the best placed competitor trained by the BHHA this season for the first time.

Judging will be done on a points basis:

Quality of cutting, finish of cut stool and absence of “splitting back”.	40 Points
Selection and best use of crooks leading to overall hedge strength.	30 Points
Best use of available material.	20 Points
General appearance of finished hedge. Tidiness of working area.	10 Points

CHAINSAWS & SAFETY

Competitors may use chainsaws provided they wear personal protection equipment (PPE): chainsaw trousers, boots, helmet and gloves. The Novice classes are not expected to use chainsaws but may do so if they abide by the conditions above.

Competitors without chainsaws, or those without PPE will be able to call upon the assistance of chainsaw stewards.

The organisers carry public liability insurance but have no insurance for personal accidents and cannot accept responsibility for any such accidents.

Competitors are reminded that by signing in on the day they acknowledge the above and have agreed to comply with current Health and Safety regulations when using a chainsaw.
